Reprinted Items

Reprinted Items from the 1964, 1965, 1970, 1980, 1982, and 2003 Minutes of the Northern New Salem

- I. Year 1964 Item 15: By move and second the Association agreed to answer the request from several churches touching upon the question of sisters cutting their hair, using make-up, etc. As follows: It is the duty of every moderator of every church to exercise strict disciplinary action toward the violation of established practices. To insist on strict compliance with what sayeth the scripture concerning a woman of righteousness. Mark them that would creep in the assembly just to destroy the peace and salvation of the church.
- II. Year 1965 Item 16: That each church in our union shall hold its own key, and it is to be the sole judge of the members as long as it does not violate the Word of God, the order of the Association or Old Regular Baptist principles.
- III. Year 1970 Item 17: The request from the Little Ruth Church "Asking for advise on how should a minister who has been excluded from preaching with sects and orders contrary to Regular Baptist principles can be received back into the fellowship of a Regular Baptist Church." We as an advisory council say to all our churches that you may restore such one upon strict examination, BUT not to return to them their credentials until they have been reexamined by legal presbytery.
- IV. **Year 1980 Item 12**: By a motion and second, the request from the Little Rebecca Church was granted to correct Item #13 of our 1979 minutes to read as follows:

We, the Little Rebecca Church of Old Regular Baptist of Jesus Christ having met at our regular meeting time being found in full love and fellowship of all members present agreed unanimously to send the following request to the Northern New Salem Association when convened with the Little Ida Church on Friday before the first Saturday in August 1979. "We, the Little Rebecca Church request the Northern New Salem Association to adopt a resolution against members of our churches belong to secret orders such as Masons, Odd Fellows or any other related worldly organization that is an offense to our Sister Association as well as our own brethren". This question has produced friction far too long in our union and we feel it is contrary to our fundamental Christian beliefs and our church principles as we are not to be a part of a worldy kingdom. And farther that we advise all of our churches having such members to rid themselves of any members that refuse to disassociate themselves from such organizations. (And not preach with any preacher that belongs to a secret organization.)

V. **Year 1982-Item 13**: Moved and second to grant the requests from Antioch, Family of Love, Little Ruth, and Little Rebecca Churches. Concerning omitting item number 13,

page 10, year 1967 of the Northern New Salem Association minutes, and adopt item number 17, page 4 of the 1970 minutes of our mother the New Salem Association, which reads as follows: Not to use any man with two living women, (or whose wife has two living men) to preach in the bounds of the Northern New Salem Association and the Moderators to adhere to this advice. An objection was made to this move. A vote was take, 42 voted in favor of the motion, 21 against, motion carried, request granted.

VI. Year 2003 – Item 15: A motion was made by Eld. Larry Newsome, second by Eld. Harrison Runyon that we as an adviser and counselor answer the request of the Pleasant View, Eternal Rose and True Vine Churches concerning Item #17 of our 2002 Minutes. The following will replace Item #17:

> "We say to our churches to advise their ministers to refrain from taking any part in the services of churches not in correspondence with the Northern New Salem Association. This means preaching or baptizing members into their fellowship. If this is violated the minister will be silenced for a period of time, satisfactory to his home church. Under no circumstance will this be less than twelve (12) months for the first offense, and if this should happen a second time he would automatically be excluded. Concerning funerals: If a family wants a minister of the Old Regular Baptist faith to participate in a funeral service where another church minister (not of our correspondence) is going to take part or be used in part of the services. This is acceptable as long as the Regular Baptist minister separates the services by song, prayer and dismission called. See Item #17 of our 1970 Minutes. This advice is to be printed in our Minutes until future action is taken

Friday, August 5, 2022

On this lovely Friday morning, it was a joy to watch as brothers, sisters, and friends of the Northern New Salem and corresponding associations began to gather in the sanctuary of the Little Rebecca Church. After singing some beautiful songs of Zion, Elder Ray Hamilton welcomed everyone to our 64th Association.

Alternate, Elder Joe Gibson was called on to introduce the services. Elder Joe Gibson was blessed to preach about how people should be concerned about the state of their souls and their relationship with God. Brother Joe preached about the signs of time beginning to draw nigh to the coming of the Lord and that people needed to get ready. Brother Joe was then blessed to pray a humble prayer.

Having been chosen by the delegates at our 2021 session to preach the Introductory Sermon for this year, Elder Larry Dixon approached the stand and was soon blessed to preach the gospel. Brother Larry's text was on laboring for the meat that will last. He preached about that bread that came down from God out of Heaven. Then he continued to warn about being led astray by that strange woman that waits on the street corner to lure away the hearts of men and women. And finally, he advised the church to love the brethren fervently.

Those who were not delegates were asked to walk to the pavilion where the preaching would be conducted. The delegates were advised to assemble in the sanctuary of the Little Rebecca Church, where the business of the Association would begin. The following Elders were chosen to preach at the place arranged: Elders: (1) Elder Stoney Blackburn-Sardis Association; (2) Elder Gary Blevins-Philadelphia Association; (3) Elder David Lester – Old Friendship Association; (4) Elder Jimmy Amos- Union Association; and (5) Elder Kevin Blevins- Old Indian Bottom Association.

After gathering in the house and singing one of Zion's songs- **Elder Tommy Dials** -Sardis Association was called on to make remarks and lead in prayer.

Our beloved Moderator, **Elder Ray Hamilton**, announced that the 64th Annual Session of the Northern New Salem Association was now ready to begin the work of the Association.

- a) The Assistant Moderator called for the letters from the churches that compose the Northern New Salem Association to be handed to the Clerk. The Clerk read the letter from the Little Rebecca Church. A motion was made by Elder John Elkins, second by Brother Raymond Henderson, to receive the letters, seat the delegates and refer all queries and requests to the Committee on Arrangements.
- b) The Northern New Salem Association of Old Regular Baptist faith organized by electing the following officers to serve the next year. The following Brothers were appointed to tally the vote: **Elder Paul D. Moore**, Philadelphia Association, **Elder Hobart Hamilton**, Sardis Association, and **Elder Charles Blevins**, Union Association.

- Noted by the Association concerning our Finance Committee. It was moved and seconded that our Finance Committee be appointed at the same time as the election of officers, the Moderator appointed: Elder Tommy Dials, Sardis Association, Elder Richard Staton, Sardis Association, and Brother Edgar Baker Jr., Friendship Association. Elder Phillip Beverly made a motion, second by Elder Doug McCarty, to receive the report of the committee appointed and discharge them of their duties.
- c) By a motion made by Elder Doug McCarty, second by Elder William B. Holbrook, the Moderator was authorized to make all temporary appointments. Elder Ray Hamilton then appointed Elder Scott Little as the Second Assistant Clerk of the Northern New Salem Association.
- d) By a motion made by **Elder Danny Carty**, second by **Elder Justin Hagerman**, the Clerks read the Rules of Decorum and the Articles of Faith, omitting reading of the Constitution.
- e) Called for legally organized churches of our same faith and order desiring to join our union, and none responded.

- f) Called for Associations of our same faith and order desiring to continue a Godly correspondence, and the following responded by letter and delegate:
 - New Salem--Represented by the following delegates: Bryan Adams, Northern Gail Brown, and Eric Lawson. Letter in the hand of Elder Northern Gail Brown. A motion was made by Elder Phillip Beverly and second by Brother Ralph Manuel to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - ii. Union--Represented by the following delegates: Dennis Elkins, Barry Lucas, Bobby Johnson, Jeff Owens, Bill Blevins, Jimmy Amos, Gary Sanders, Charles Blevins, Danny Adams, and Timothy Sparkman. Letter in the hand of Elder Bill Blevins. A motion was made by Elder John Elkins and second by Elder Hargis Tuttle to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - iii. Philadelphia--Represented by the following delegates: Gary Adkins, Lowell Adkins, Gary Blevins, Paul D. Moore, Clyde Lewis, Farrell Howard, Willis Tolliver, Gary Adkins Jr., Scott Adkins, Wayne Caudill, Jimmy Stewart, Shane Elkins, Mark McClanahan, Darrell Kidd, and Zach Stewart. Letter in the hand of Elder Gary Adkins. A motion was made by Elder Doug McCarty and second by Elder Adam Moore to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - iv. Sardis--Represented by the following delegates: Hobart Hamilton, Thomas J. Dials, Stony Blackburn, Richard Staton, Marion Duncan, Alvin Thornbury, Todd Dials, and Buster Hall. Letter in the hand of Elder Thomas J. Dials. A motion was made by Elder Andy Fields and second by Elder Bill Smith to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - v. Old Friendship—Represented by the following delegates: Edgar Baker Jr., Steve Baker, David Lester, Gary Estep, and Fred Bailey. Letter in the hand of Brother Edgar Baker Jr. A motion was made by Elder Phillip Beverly and second by Brother Raymond Henderson to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - vi. Old Indian Bottom--Represented by the following delegates: Aaron Whitaker Jr., Cody Jones, Travis Lewis, Kevin Blevins, Earl Blevins, Jeff Lewis, Wendall Lykins, and Delmar Jones. Letter in the hand of Brother Wendall Lykins. A motion was made by Brother James Wagner and second by Elder Harvey Tuttle

to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.

The Moderator appointed a committee consisting of the delegates from the Little Rebecca Church, together with one delegate from each of the other churches, to arrange the ministers for Friday evening and Saturday morning, who reported as follows:

Friday evening – Allow the Moderator and Assistant Moderator to make arrangements.

Saturday morning—Elders (1) Aaron Whitaker- Old Indian Bottom Association; (2) Hobart Hamilton-Sardis Association (3) Barry Lucas-Union Association; (4) Jeff Lewis- Old Indian Bottom Association; (5) Elder Timothy Sparkman- Union Association.

- g) Called for transient ministers and members of our same faith and order and the following responded: Elder Morris Wicker, Elder Billy Miller, Elder Larry Newsome, and Elder Mike Fortner
- h) A motion was made by **Elder Doug McCarty**, second by **Elder Steven Miller** that we, the Northern New Salem Association, correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations: (a) New Salem, (b) Union, (c) Philadelphia, (d) Sardis, (e) Old Friendship, and (f) Old Indian Bottom.
- The Moderator appointed a committee to arrange the agenda for Saturday, consisting of one delegate from each church, together with the officers of the Northern New Salem Association and the officers and delegates from our corresponding associations. The committee on Arrangements is to meet at the house at 1:30 p.m. Friday.
 - Elder Phillip Beverly made a motion, second by Brother Skeeter
 Pridemore, that we, the Northern New Salem Association, adjourn until
 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, August 6, 2022.
 - ii. The committee met pursuant to adjournment Friday afternoon and completed its work on the Bill of Arrangements. The services for the evening were introduced by **Elder Paul D. Moore**, prayer held by the same, and closed by **Elder Barry Lucas**.

Saturday, August 6, 2022

Per having met pursuant to adjournment, the Association delegates and attendees reconvened at the Little Rebecca Church on the second day of three of the Northern New Salem Association.

As the sanctuary of the Little Rebecca Church began to fill, you could feel the love flowing among the children of God. Once again, brothers and sisters of the seven corresponding associations were gathered together to worship the God of glory.

Services for the morning were introduced by **Elder Ralph Caudill** of the Little Ida Church of the Northern New Salem Association. A song was called for, and then **Elder Danny Adams** of the Union Association offered a humble prayer.

- 1. Called the roll of delegates and marked the absentees.
- 2. The Assistant Clerk read the Bill of Arrangements. A motion was made by **Elder John Elkins** and seconded by **Elder Phillip Beverly** to receive the Bill of Arrangements and discharge the committee.
- 3. The Circular Letter written by **Elder Joe Gibson** for our 2022 session was read. A motion was made by **Elder Hargis Tuttle** and seconded by **Elder Steve Slone** to receive the letter and have it printed in our 2022 minutes. Objections were called for, and none responded.
- 4. The Finance Committee appointed Friday, Item 2(a), consisting **of Elder Tommy Dials**, Sardis Association, **Brother Edgar Baker Jr.**, Old Friendship Association, and **Elder Richard Staton**, Sardis Association, reported as follows:

Brother Rodney Slone made a motion, seconded by **Elder Doug McCarty** to receive the Treasurer's Report.

- 6. **Brother Raymond Henderson** made a motion, and **Elder John Elkins** seconded the motion that **Elder Wayne Sartin** be appointed recording secretary. He is to have 2,150 copies of the current minutes printed and distributed among the churches according to their contributions. The secretary is to receive \$0 for his services. The printer's fee is to appear on the front cover.
- 7. The brothers appointed to take the vote for who is to preach the Introductory Sermon: Elder David Lester, Old Friendship Association; Elder Paul D. Moore, Philadelphia Association; Elder Danny Adams, Union Association; and who is to write the Circular Letter: Elder Stoney Blackburn, Sardis Association; Elder Richard Staton, Sardis Association; Elder Dennis Elkins, Union Association for 2023.

The following ministers were chosen to preach Saturday evening and Sunday morning:

Saturday evening: (1) **Elder Charles Hagerman** – Northern New Salem Association, (2) **Elder Dennis Elkins** – Union Association, and (3) **Elder Phillip Beverly** – Northern New Salem Association. Sunday morning: **Officers of the Northern New Salem Association**.

By a vote of the delegates, **Elder Harvey Tuttle** was chosen to preach the Introductory Sermon, **Elder Daniel Newsome** to be his alternate, and **Elder Phillip Beverly** to write the Circular Letter for our 65th Annual Session.

- 8. In compliance with Item 7 of Friday's work, we, the Northern New Salem Association, agreed to correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations:
 - (a.) **New Salem**: When convened with the host churches, to be held at the Association Building, Minnie, Floyd County, KY. They are beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in September 2022 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend are Scott Little, Nathaniel Caudill, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Ray Hamilton, Hillard Newsome, Hargis Tuttle, and Eugene Couch. **Elder Hillard Newsome** is to carry the letter
 - (b.) **Union:** When convened with the host churches and co-host churches. To be held at the Association Building, Ashcamp, Pike County, KY. Beginning on Friday before the third Saturday in September 2022 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend are Scott Little, Scott Hamilton, Nathaniel Caudill, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Ray Hamilton, and Hillard Newsome. **Elder Scott Little** is to carry the letter
 - (c.) **Philadelphia**: When convened with the host church at the Association Building, at 522 5th Ave., Worthington, KY. They are beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in August 2022 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend are Jimmy King, Scott Little, Scott Hamilton, Nathaniel Caudill, Danny Carty, Adam Moore, Billy Miller, Patrick Deel, Ray Hamilton, John Elkins, Larry Newsome, and Harold Hicks. Letter in the hand of **Elder Adam Moore**.
 - (d.) **Sardis**: When convened with the host church and co-hosting churches at the permanent association building, Varney, KY, beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in September 2022 and the following two days. Delegates to attend are Scott Little, Scott Hamilton, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Ray Hamilton, and Hillard Newsome. The letter is in the hand of Elder Wayne Sartin.
 - (e.) **Old Friendship:** When convened with the host church Pine Grove and co-host church Old Sulphur Springs at the 3977 Old Guesses Fork Rd., Hurley, VA, beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in August 2022 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend are Scott Hamilton, Scott Little, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Ray Hamilton, and Hillard Newsome. Letter in the hand of **Elder Danny Carty**.
 - (f.) Old Indian Bottom: When convened with the host church at the Philadelphia Association Building, at 522 5th Ave., Worthington, KY., beginning on Friday before the first Saturday in September 2022 and continuing the two following days. Note: Due to recent flooding in eastern Kentucky and the loss of the building at the Mallet Fork Church, the Old Indian Bottom Association was unable to meet at their normal location. Delegates to attend are Scott Hamilton, Scott Little, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Billy Miller, Ray Hamilton, Patrick Deel, and John Elkins. Letter in the hand of Elder John Elkins.

- 9. Note the request from the Little Flossie Church to dedicate the 2022 session of the Northern New Salem Association to the memory of Elder Russell Hicks. Motion made by Brother Raymond Henderson seconded by Brother James Wagner to grant the request and let them become a part of our permanent record. An objection was called for, and none responded. (See page 2 of the 2022 minute)
- 10. Note the request from the Antioch Church to make it a standing item to read the Constitution, Rules of Decorum, and Articles of Faith during the Friday business session of the Northern New Salem Association. Motion made by **Elder Doug McCarty** seconded by **Elder Danny Carty**. An objection was called for, and none responded. *Note: From this year* (2022) *hereafter, the Moderator of this body will not call for the omission of the reading of the Constitution, the Rules of the Decorum, and the Articles of Faith will be called for in the assembly of the Northern New Salem Association until a request is made similarly.*
- 11. Note the request from the Little Angel church that we reestablish the practice of announcing/printing the event of excluding a minister in the Northern New Salem Association minute. Motion made by **Brother Skeeter Pridemore** seconded by **Brother James Wagner**. An objection was called for, and none responded.
- 12. Note the request from the Family of Love and Little Ida churches that item 13 of our 1982 minutes become a standing item to be printed in our minutes every year, stating that double married brothers will not be used "in the bounds" of the Northern New Salem Association. Motion made by **Elder Doug McCarty** seconded by **Elder Zachariah Collins**. An objection was called for, and none responded. (See Item V in the list of reprinted items of this minute.)
- 13. The request to host the 2023 association from the Pleasant View Church was read. A motion was made by **Brother Ralph Manuel** seconded by **Elder Doug McCarty** to grant the request of the Pleasant View Church the honor of hosting and the Eternal Rose, Lily of the Valley, Little Edna, and Mt. Olive Church to co-host the 2023 setting of this blessed old association.
- 14. Elder Steven Miller made a motion, seconded by Brother Ralph Manuel, to forego the reading of the current minutes.
- 15. A motion was made by **Brother Raymond Henderson**, seconded by **Brother Rodney Slone**, to adjourn to the place and time mentioned in Item 13 of Saturday's work in the current minutes.

The 64th Session was closed out by **Elder Buster Hall** of the Sardis Association, who was blessed to offer up a humble prayer.

Sabbath Morning, August 7, 2022

As the brothers, sisters, and friends of the Northern New Salem association gathered in the Little Rebecca Church for this final day of the association, you could feel the joy and love. Although they were getting ready to depart, they were thankful that God had blessed this association one more time.

Soon, morning services began, and you could feel the spirit in the old songs of Zion. As they lined, "Oh Ye Young, Ye Gay Ye Proud," you could feel the presence of the elder brothers and sisters who paved the way in this old church. Elder Danny Carty welcomed the congregation and announced the arrangements for the day.

The arrangements were as follows:

- 1. Elder Timothy Sparkman- Union Association introduced and led in prayer
- 2. Elder Scott Little
- 3. Elder Wayne Sartin
- 4. Elder Ray Hamilton
- 5. Elder Hillard Newsome sang Keep Your Lamp Trimmed and Burning and then was blessed

to close the meeting with much rejoicing

(Elder Scott Hamilton was feeling poorly and was unable to attend)

Thank God we could come together and worship the King of kings one more time. Amen.

ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust, and that the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.

ARTICLE 10. We believe that no minister has a right to administer the ordinances and commands of the gospel, except such as are regular baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the gospel, and has come under the hands of a regular chosen presbytery of the church and ordained thereby.

ARTICLE 11. We believe that it is the duty of all church members to contribute money for defraying all reasonable expenses of the church, never forgetting the poor, according to their several abilities.

ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage, or indulge people in their sins, or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation, is erroneous, and such doctrine will be rejected by us.

Matt. 16:12, Acts 8:16-21, Romans 16:17-18, Eph. 4:14-15, Gal. 1:8-10

ARTICLE 13. We believe that the church of Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ, who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and with one another, and have given themselves to the Lord, and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline, according to the rules of the gospel.

Acts 2:42, 1st John 1:3

ARTICLE 14. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the church, and the government thereof is upon his shoulders.

Isaiah 9:6-7, Ch. 22:21-22, Luke 1:33

ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. We also believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only; thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother, and children.

Eph. 5:22, 23, 28, St. Mark 10:6-8, Romans 1:26, 27

ARTICLE 16. None of the articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation, so as to make God partial directly, indirectly, or to injure any of the children of men; nor shall any of these articles be altered without legal notice, and free consent.

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTHERN NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION ORGANIZED IN 1957

From a long series of experiences we, the Old Regular Baptist Church of Jesus Christ, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

ARTICLE I. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.

ARTICLE II. In the letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.

ARTICLE III. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the union.

ARTICLE IV. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.

ARTICLE V. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

ARTICLE VI. New Churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.

ARTICLE VII. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.

ARTICLE VII. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.

ARTICLE IX. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with Minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE X. We think it necessary that we should have an Association fund for defraying expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.

ARTICLE XI. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.

ARTICLE XII. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.

ARTICLE XIII. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.

ARTICLE XIV. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of a majority of the delegates present, except in receiving and dismissing churches and Associations which shall be by a unanimous vote.

ARTICLE XV. The Association shall have the power for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent them at any time in the Association; to appropriate money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any members, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to a seat with us; The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. The Association shall have a moderator, an assistant moderator, clerk, and assistant clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

3. Only one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfections but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can as to convey his ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.

7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association.

8. No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term of appellation than that of "Brother".

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any members from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the rules of decorum.

11. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Moderator requires.

12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member provided the chair be filled. And he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.

13. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
