

REPRINTED ITEMS

Items from 1964, 1965, 1970, 1980, 1982, and 2003 Minutes of the Northern New Salem

- I. Year 1964 Item 15: By move and second the Association agreed to answer the request from several churches touching upon the question of sisters cutting their hair, using make-up, etc. As follows: It is the duty of every moderator of every church to exercise strict disciplinary action toward the violation of established practices. To insist on strict compliance with what sayeth the scripture concerning a woman of righteousness. Mark them that would creep in the assembly just to destroy the peace and salvation of the church.
- II. Year 1965 Item 16: That each church in our union shall hold its own key, and it is to be the sole judge of the members as long as it does not violate the Word of God, the order of the Association or Old Regular Baptist principles.
- III. Year 1970 Item 17: The request from the Little Ruth Church "Asking for advise on how should a minister who has been excluded from preaching with sects and orders contrary to Regular Baptist principles can be received back into the fellowship of a Regular Baptist Church." We as an advisory council say to all our churches that you may restore such one upon strict examination, BUT not to return to them their credentials until they have been reexamined by legal presbytery.
- IV. Year 1980 Item 12: By a motion and second, the request from the Little Rebecca Church was granted to correct Item #13 of our 1979 minutes to read as follows:
 - We, the Little Rebecca Church of Old Regular Baptist, of Jesus Christ having met at our regular meeting time being found in full love and fellowship of all members present agreed unanimously to send the following request to the Northern New Salem Association when convened with the Little Ida Church on Friday before the first Saturday in August 1979. "We, the Little Rebecca Church request the Northern New Salem Association to adopt a resolution against members of our churches belong to secret orders such as Masons, Odd Fellows or any other related worldly organization that is an offense to our Sister Association as well as our own brethren". This question has produced friction far too long in our union and we feel it is contrary to our fundamental Christian beliefs and our church principles as we are not to be a part of a worldy kingdom. And farther that we advise all of our churches having such members to rid themselves of any members that refuse to disassociate themselves from such organizations. (And not preach with any preacher that belongs to a secret organization.)
- V. Year 1982-Item 13: Moved and second to grant the requests from Antioch, Family of Love, Little Ruth, and Little Rebecca Churches. Concerning omitting item number 13, page 10, year 1967 of the Northern New Salem Association minutes, and adopt item number 17, page 4 of the 1970 minutes of our mother the New Salem Association, which reads as follows: Not to use any man with two living women, (or whose wife has two living men) to preach in the bounds of the Northern New Salem Association and the Moderators to adhere to this advice. An objection was made to this move. A vote was taken, 42 voted in favor of the motion, 21 against, motion carried, request granted.
- VI. Year 2003 Item 15: A motion was made by Eld. Larry Newsome, second by Eld. Harrison Runyon that we as an adviser and counselor answer the request of the Pleasant View, Eternal Rose and True Vine Churches concerning Item #17 of our 2002 Minutes. The following will replace Item #17:

"We say to our churches to advise their ministers to refrain from taking any part in the services of churches not in correspondence with the Northern New Salem Association. This means preaching or baptizing members into their fellowship. If this is violated the minister will be silenced for a period of time, satisfactory to his home church. Under no circumstance will this be less than twelve (12) months for the first offense, and if this should happen a second time, he would automatically be excluded. Concerning funerals: If a family wants a minister of the Old Regular Baptist faith to participate in a funeral service where another church minister (not of our correspondence) is going to take part or be used in part of the services. This is acceptable as long as the Regular Baptist minister separates the services by song, prayer and dismission called. See Item #17 of our 1970 Minutes. This advice is to be printed in our Minutes until future action is taken.

PROCEEDINGS of the

67th ANNUAL SESSION

of the

NORTHERN NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION of OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH of JESUS CHRIST AUGUST 1-3, 2025

Friday, August 1, 2025

It was a warm and welcoming morning as the brothers and sisters began to gather at the Rose of Sharon Church. After several moments of handshakes, hugs, and heartfelt embraces, the brethren called for a song. **Elder Nathaniel Caudill** of the *Philadelphia* Association began to line "*Brethren*, *We Have Met Again*". As the voices of the congregation joined together in this song of Zion, a deep sense of joy filled the house. After a few more songs were sung, our beloved moderator, **Elder Ray Hamilton** came to the stand to offer a heartfelt welcome to all who had assembled for the 67th session of our Association.

The alternate **Elder Ishmael Hall** was then called upon to introduce the services. He came to the stand in a humble spirit, saying, "I love the Lord, for He gave me life. I want to please the Lord" (Psalm 116:1; Acts 17:25). He was soon blessed to preach, reminding the congregation that those who come hungering and thirsting after righteousness shall be filled (*Matthew 5:6*). He spoke of longing for a place he had never been (*Hebrews 11:10*), and of the peace that comes from heeding that low, still voice (1 Kings 19:12)¹. "He will tell you what you must do," he said, "if you are to see a home in heaven" (*Acts 9:6; John 14:2*).

Having been chosen by the delegates at our 2024 session to deliver the Introductory Sermon, **Elder Stephen Slone** then approached the stand, expressing how blessed we are to gather once more in this sacred setting. He reminded us that it takes the Lord to bless all that we do (*Psalm 127:1*), and testified of a God who is ever present — a God who walks with His people (*Deuteronomy 31:6*).

Elder Slone was blessed to preach of that faithful God who never forsakes His children. "It is all about Him," he proclaimed. "It never was about us. For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" (*Romans* 3:23). "Nothing unclean or impure will enter heaven; therefore, something must be done to us. We must repent and be born again. There is only one way into the kingdom, and that is Jesus" (*Revelation* 21:27; *John* 3:3; *Acts* 2:38; *John* 14:6).

He exhorted us that now is the time to be about our Father's business (*Luke* 2:49). In his closing words, **Elder Slone** urged that all we do should bring honor and glory to God—for He alone is worthy of all things (*1 Corinthians* 10:31; *Revelation* 4:11).

Those who were not delegates were asked, (by the moderator), to go to the pavilion where the preaching would be conducted. The delegates were advised to assemble in the sanctuary of the Rose of Sharon Church where the business of the Association would begin. The following Elders were chosen to preach in the pavilion:

After gathering in the house and singing one of Zion's songs, **Elder Hobart Hamilton**, *Sardis Association*, was called on to make remarks and **Elder Stoney Blackburn**, *Sardis Association*, *led* in prayer.

Our beloved Moderator, *Elder Ray Hamilton*, announced that the 67th Annual Session of the Northern New Salem Association was now ready to begin the work of the Association.

- a) The Assistant Moderator called for the letters from the churches that compose the Northern New Salem Association to be handed to the Clerk. The letter from the Rose of Sharon Church was read by the Clerk. A motion was made by **Elder Phillip Beverly** second by **Brother Raymond Henderson** to receive the letters, seat the delegates, and refer all queries and requests to the Committee on Arrangements
- b) The Northern New Salem Association of Old Regular Baptist faith organized by electing the following officers to serve the next year. The following Brothers were appointed to take the vote: **Brother Alvin Thornbury** *Sardis Association*, **Elder Charles Blevins** *Union Association*, and **Elder Chuck Hall**, New Salem Association

- i. Noted by the Association concerning our Finance Committee. It was moved and seconded that our Finance Committee be appointed at the same time of the election of officers. The Moderator appointed: Elder Nathaniel Caudill Philadelphia Association, Elder Stoney Blackburn- Sardis Association, and Elder Estill Hamilton- Union Association. Elder Joe Gibson made a motion, second by Elder Larry Newsome to receive the report of the committee appointed and discharge them of their duties.
- c) By a motion made by **Elder Glen Slone** second by **Elder Ishmael Hall, Jr.** that the Moderator was authorized to make all temporary appointments, for the remainder of the year.
- d) The Moderator called on the clerks to read the Constitution, Rules of Decorum, and the Articles of Faith. (In compliance with Item 10, Saturday's work 2022 NNSA)
- e) Called for legally organized churches of our same faith and order desiring to join our union, and one responded.

- a. House of Prayer Church Letter referred to the committee on arrangement and their delegates were given a seat with us. This move was made by **Elder Danny Carty**, and seconded by **Elder Phillip Beverly**
- f) Called for Associations of our same faith and order desiring to continue a Godly correspondence, and the following responded by letter and delegate:
 - i. New Salem-- Represented by the following delegates: Chuck Hall, Deffort Thornsberry, and Carlos Akers. The letter was in the hands of Brother Carlos Akers. A motion was made by Elder Larry Newsome and second by Brother Raymond Henderson to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - ii. Union--Represented by the following delegates: *Gerald Akers, Bobby Johnson, Jimmy Stacy, Ray Coleman, Danny Adams, Jeff Dillon, Charles Blevins, Carvil Addington, Estill Hamilton, Lonnie Staton, Estil Nichols, Paul Hall, and Jack Fraley. The letter in the hand of Brother Bobby <i>Johnson*. A motion was made by **Brother Rodney Slone** and second by **Elder William B. Holbrook** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - iii. Philadelphia--Represented by the following delegates: *Dallas Bledsoe Jr., Gary Adkins, Gary Adkins Jr., Clyde P. Lewis, Preston Lewis, Nathaniel Caudill, Darrell Kidd, Scott Adkins, Wayne Caudill, Lee Blevins Jr., Gary Blevins, Lowell Adkins, Matthew Isom,* and *Timothy Cremeans*. The letter was in the hands of: <u>Elder Nathaniel Caudill</u> A motion was made by **Elder Ishmael Hall Jr.** and second by **Elder Adam Moore** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - iv. Sardis--Represented by the following delegates: *Tommy Dials, Todd Dials, Richard Staton, Stony Blackburn, Hobart Hamilton, Alvin Thornbury, Butler Fletcher, Richie Hale,* and *Ron Hamilton.* Letter in the hand of <u>Elder Stoney Blackburn</u>. A motion was made by **Brother Jack Dials** and second by **Brother Rodney Slone** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - v. Old Friendship—Represented by the following delegates:. *Gary Estep, Edgar Baker Jr., Larry Mullins, Roger Baker, Tarzan Justus, Austin Mullins, Andrew Ford*, and James Stacy. Letter in the hand of <u>Elder Andrew Ford</u>. A motion was made by **Elder Andy Fields** and second by **Elder William B. Holbrook** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
 - vi. Old Indian Bottom-- Represented by the following delegates: *Travis Lewis* and Robbie *Cordel*. Letter in the hand of <u>Brother Robbie Cordle</u>. A motion was made by **Elder Sean Hicks** and second by **Elder Danny Carty** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.

The Moderator appointed a committee consisting of the delegates from the Rose of Sharon Church together with one delegate from each of the other churches, to arrange the ministers for Friday evening and Saturday morning, who reported as follows:

Friday evening: Moderator to choose from the elders who were present.

Saturday morning: Elder Todd Dials (Sardis), Elder Matthew Isom (Philadelphia), Elder Tarzan Justus (Old Friendship), Elder Estill Hamilton (Union), and Elder Danny Adams (Union)

- g) Called for transient ministers and members of our same faith and order and **Elder Ralph**Caudill responded
- h) A motion was made by **Elder Steven Miller**, second by **Brother Doc Johnson** that we, the Northern New Salem Association, correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations: (a) New Salem; (b) Union (c) Philadelphia; (d) Sardis; (e) Old Friendship; and (f) Old Indian Bottom.
- i) The Moderator appointed a committee to arrange the agenda for Saturday, consisting of one delegate from each church, together with the officers of the Northern New Salem Association and the officers and delegates from our corresponding associations. The committee on Arrangements is to meet at the house at 1:30 p.m. Friday.
- j) **Brother Jesse Hicks** made a motion, second by **Elder Nick Hansen** that we, the Northern New Salem Association, adjourn until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, August 2, 2025.

Saturday, August 2, 2025

In accordance with having met pursuant to adjournment, on this the second day of three of the Northern New Salem Association, the Association delegates and attenders reconvened at the Rose of Sharon Church.

As the sanctuary of the Rose of Sharon Church began to fill, you could feel the love and witness the fellowship of those pilgrims who had waited another year to come together at this glorious, old association. Truly you could bear witness to the Savior's love as his spirit flowed among his children.

Services for the morning were introduced by **Elder Tommy Dials** of the Sardis Association. A song was called for and then a humble prayer was offered by the same elder.

In accordance with the standard order of parliamentary procedure, the Northern New Salem Association assembled themselves and began their 2025 working session.

- ITEM 1. Called the roll of delegates and marked the absentees.
- The Clerk read the Bill of Arrangements. A motion was made by **Brother Rodney Slone** and seconded by **Brother James Wagner** to receive the Bill of Arrangements and discharge the committee.
- The Circular Letter written by **Elder Jason Hagerman** for our 2025 session was read. A motion was made by **Elder Scott Little** and seconded by **Brother James Wagner** to receive the letter and have it printed in our 2025 minutes. Objections were called for, and none responded. (Circular Letter on <u>page 12</u>)

ITEM 4. The report was presented by the Finance Committee appointed Friday under Item 2(a), consisting of *Elder Nathanel Caudill* of the *Philadelphia Association*, *Elder Stoney Blackburn* of the *Sardis Association*, and *Elder Estill Hamilton* of the *Union Association*. The Clerk of the *Northern New Salem Association* proceeded to read the treasury report:

Brother Raymond Henderson made a motion, seconded by **Brother Phillip Beverly** to receive the Treasurer's Report.

- ITEM 6. Brother Ralph Manual made a motion, and Elder Ishmael Hall Jr. seconded the motion that Elder Wayne Sartin be appointed recording secretary. He is to have 1,325 copies of the 2025 minutes printed and distributed among the churches according to their contributions. The secretary is to receive \$0.00 for his services. The printer's fee is to appear on the front cover.
- The brothers were appointed to take the vote for who is to preach the Introductory Sermon: Elder James Stacy (Old Friendship Association); Brother Bobby Johnson (Union Association); Elder Richard Staton (Sardis Association); and who is to write the Circular Letter: Elder Tommy Dials (Sardis Association); Elder Andrew Ford (Old Friendship Association); Brother Alvin Thornbury (Sardis Association) for 2026.
 - 1. By the majority vote of the delegates, <u>Elder Danny Carty</u> was chosen to preach the *Introductory Sermon*, <u>Elder Glen Slone</u> to be his alternate, and *Elder Greg Sowards* to write the *Circular Letter* for our 68th Annual Session.

The following ministers were chosen to preach Saturday evening and Sunday morning:

- Saturday evening: At the discretion of the Moderator depending on who attends.
- Sunday Morning: The officers of the Northern New Salem Association
- ITEM 8. In compliance with *Item 7 of Friday's work*, we the Northern New Salem Association, agreed to correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations:
 - i. **New Salem:** When convened with the host churches at the Association Building, Minnie, Floyd County, KY. Beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in September 2025 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Scott Hamilton, Ray Hamilton, Ishmael Hall Jr., Scott Little, Danny Carty, Wayne Sartin, Eugene Couch,* and *Larry Newsome*. *Elder Scott Little* is to carry the letter.
 - ii. **Union:** When convened with the host churches and cohost churches at the Association Building, Ashcamp, Pike County, KY. Beginning on Friday before the third Saturday in September 2025 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Scott Hamilton, Ray Hamilton, Scott Little, Eric Nichols*, and *Wayne Sartin*. *Elder Scott Little* is to carry the letter.
 - iii. **Philadelphia:** When convened with the host church at the Association Building, at 522 5th Ave., Worthington, KY. Beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in August 2025 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Jimmy King, Ray Hamilton, Matthew Jones, Wayne Sartin, Danny Carty, Eugene Couch, Adam Moore,* and *Harold Hicks.* <u>Elder Danny Carty</u> is to carry the letter.
 - iv. **Sardis:** When convened with the host church and cohosting churches at the permanent association building, Varney, KY, beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in September 2025 and the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Scott Hamilton, Ray Hamilton, Matthew Jones, Wayne Sartin, Danny Carty, Scott Little, Glen Slone*, and *Larry Newsome*. *Elder Scott Hamilton* is to carry the letter.

- v. **Old Friendship:** When convened with the host church and co-host churches at the Panther Creek Church beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in August 2025 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Scott Hamilton, Ray Hamilton, Wayne Sartin*, and *Scott Little*. <u>Elder Wayne Sartin</u> is to carry the letter.
- vi. **Old Indian Bottom:** When convened with the host church Terrells Creek Church at the Association Building at the Indian Bottom Church, Cornettsville, KY beginning on Friday before the first Saturday in September 2025 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: *Ray Hamilton, Danny Carty*, and *Glen Slone*. <u>Elder Danny Carty</u> is to carry the letter.
- ITEM 9. Note the request from The Lilly of the Valley Church to remove Brother Sam Hamilton from the list of ordained ministers. A motion was made by **Elder Danny Carty** and a second by **Brother Kenneth Slone**.
- ITEM 10. Note the reading of the request from the Rose of Sharon Church. The request from the Rose of Sharon Church was read before the body. The content of the request was that the Association engage in an open discussion and, if the Lord is willing, find solutions that may aid in providing more long-term stability for the sustainability of our churches and of the Association as a whole.

After an extended discussion, the moderator asked for a motion and a second to *reject* the request, citing difficulty among the brethren in fully understanding its intent. **Elder Steven Miller** made the motion, and **Brother Doc Johnson** offered the second.

Elder William B. Holbrook then objected to the motion and second. A vote was taken, with 16 voting in favor of rejecting the request and 29 voting in favor of accepting it. At this point, **Elder Sean Hicks** expressed concern that there was confusion, noting that both brethren who had moved to reject the request had voted to accept it. **Elder Steven Miller** then rose and clarified that he had done so at the request of the moderator to continue the parliamentary process, and not as an expression of personal conviction. **Elder Sean Hicks** again rose, stating that such actions could create a perception of inconsistency, and that as a family, we ought to deal openly and honestly with one another.

In light of this concern, **Elder Danny Carty** inquired whether the original motion and second might be withdrawn. **Elder Steven Miller** and **Brother Doc Johnson** agreed.

Elder Danny Carty then offered a new motion to accept the request from the Rose of Sharon Church, and **Elder Andy Fields** seconded the motion. **Elder Sean Hicks** objected to the motion and second. A second vote was taken, with 29 voting in favor and 15 opposed. *The motion carried*.

This exchange served as a clear reminder of the need not only for structured and prayerful dialogue but also for a spirit of mutual trust and openness when confronting difficult matters. The Association recognized that this moment was more than procedural—it was a call to humility, honesty, and listening one to another in love.

Following the vote, **Elder Ray Hamilton** requested volunteers for this committee to continue throughout the year and have at least one meeting per quarter until the subsequent association meeting. The meeting will be decided by the **Elders Scott Little**, **Elder Wayne Sartin**, and **Elder Scott Hamilton**.

The following elders volunteered to serve on the committee:

Phillip Beverly, Danny Carty, Patrick Deel, Mike Fortner, Joe Gilliam, Jason Hagerman, Justin Hagerman, Scott Hamilton, Scott Little, Steven Miller, and Wayne Sartin

This committee is to convene at least quarterly and is entrusted to carry forward the spirit of this discussion—prayerfully, thoughtfully, and in the fear of God—with a written report to be presented at the 68th Annual Session of the Northern New Salem Association².

We humbly pray that God, the All-Wise and Merciful Father, would grant these elders the wisdom to walk faithfully in this labor. May the same inspiration once given to the Ancient Church be now poured out through the Holy Spirit. May His divine thoughts fill these brethren with holy insight and purpose – those same gifts granted to the elders of old – that this work may contribute to the strengthening and sustaining of our churches, not only within the Northern New Salem Association but throughout the entire Old Regular Baptist family.

May all be done for the upbuilding and increase of the visible portion of His Kingdom.

CIRCULAR LETTER 2025

Elder Jason Hagerman (Mt. Olive Church)

ARTICLE 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

ARTICLE 7. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's church on Earth, and the mode is IMMERSION back foremost so as to cover all over.

ARTICLE 8. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Savior, and that by the use of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine and feet-washing should be kept up until His second coming, by His believers.

Matt. 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25, Luke 22:20, John 13:7-8, 1st Tim. 5:9-10

ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust, and that the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.

John 5:28-29, 1st Cor. 15:51-53, Luke 24:46

ARTICLE 10. We believe that no minister has a right to administer the ordinances and commands of the gospel, except such as are regular baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the gospel, and has come under the hands of a regular chosen presbytery of the church and ordained thereby.

Acts 13:2-3, Romans 1:6, Titus 1:5-9

ARTICLE 11. We believe that it is the duty of all church members to contribute money for defraying all reasonable expenses of the church, never forgetting the poor, according to their several abilities.

Acts 11:29, Romans 15:26, 1st Cor. 16:1-2

ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage, or indulge people in their sins, or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation, is erroneous, and such doctrine will be rejected by us.

Matt. 16:12, Acts 8:16-21, Romans 16:17-18, Eph. 4:14-15, Gal. 1:8-10

ARTICLE 13. We believe that the church of Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ, who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and with one another, and have given themselves to the Lord, and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline, according to the rules of the gospel.

Acts 2:42, 1st John 1:3

ARTICLE 14. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the church, and the government thereof is upon his shoulders.

Isaiah 9:6-7, Ch. 22:21-22, Luke 1:33

ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. We also believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only; thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother, and children.

Eph. 5:22, 23, 28, St. Mark 10:6-8, Romans 1:26, 27

ARTICLE 16. None of the articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation, so as to make God partial directly, indirectly, or to injure any of the children of men; nor shall any of these articles be altered without legal notice, and free consent.

John 3:16, Heb. 2:9

CONSTITUTION of the NORTHERN NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION

ORGANIZED IN 1957

From a long series of experiences, we, the Old Regular Baptist Church of Jesus Christ, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

ARTICLE I. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.

ARTICLE II. In the letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.

ARTICLE III. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the union.

ARTICLE IV. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.

ARTICLE V. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

ARTICLE VI. New Churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.

ARTICLE VII. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.

ARTICLE VIII. Every motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.

ARTICLE IX. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with Minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE X. We think it necessary that we should have an Association fund for defraying expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.

ARTICLE XI. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive compensation for his services.

ARTICLE XII. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.

ARTICLE XIII. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.

ARTICLE XIV. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of a majority of the delegates present, except in receiving and dismissing churches and Associations which shall be by a unanimous vote.

ARTICLE XV. The Association shall have the power for the general union of the Churches.

- 1) To preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches.
- 2) To give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty.
- 3) To inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent them at any time in the Association.
- 4) To appropriate money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper.
- 5) To appoint any members, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary.
- 6) They (*the Association*) shall have power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion.
- 7) To admit any orderly Minister of our order to a seat with us.
- 8) The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

RULES of DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. The Association shall have a moderator, an assistant moderator, clerk, and assistant clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- 3. Only one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfections but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can as to convey his ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.

- 7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association.
- 8. No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term of appellation than that of "Brother".
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any members from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the rules of decorum.
- 11. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Moderator requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member provided the chair be filled. And he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- 13. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.


